How to Use the MI-Resolve Family System

If your Friend of the Court has suggested you try the MI-Resolve Family System or you have been ordered to mediation, your local Community Dispute Resolution Program (CDRP) center can review your case to determine if mediation through MI-Resolve is appropriate. If the case is suitable for online mediation, center staff will invite you and the other parent to a private portal where a trained mediator will work with you to reach an agreement.

If your case has not been ordered to mediation but you are interested in trying MI-Resolve, you should contact your local CDRP center to learn more.
